

**BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
FRANKLIN COUNTY, KANSAS**

RESOLUTION NO. 13-06

WHEREAS, the intersection of Marshall Road with Texas Road in rural Franklin County, Kansas, is formed by the convergence of a minor east-west road *viz.* Marshall Road, and a minor north-south road, *viz.* Texas Road; and

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 8-2002, authorizes local authorities, including counties, to designate any highway as a through highway or designate any intersection or junction of roadways as a stop or yield intersection or junction, and

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 8-2008, authorizes local authorities to erect and maintain stop signs, yield signs, or other official traffic-control devices upon highways under their jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to K.S.A. 8-2003, Section 2B-5, Number 1, of the *Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices*, provides for the placement of a stop sign where the application of the normal right-of-way is unduly hazardous; and

WHEREAS, the intersection is a “T” intersection, and

IT IS THEREFORE recommended that a stop sign for southbound traffic on Texas Road be installed at the intersection of Marshall Road and Texas Road.

THAT the Board of County Commissioners hereby directs that a stop sign for southbound traffic on Texas Road be installed at the intersection of Marshall Road and Texas Road.

This resolution shall be in full force and effect following its adoption and publication in the official county newspaper, and the actual installation of the aforescribed stop sign.
